The Corona virus is very frightening. Let's make kindness go viral.



Since February 2020, the National Fraud Intelligence Bureau has identified 21 reports of fraud where the Corona virus was mentioned, with victim losses totalling over £800k. Of the 21 reports, ten were made by victims that attempted to purchase protective face masks from fraudulent sellers.

We have also received multiple reports about the corona virus themed phishing emails attempting to trick people into opening malicious attachments or revealing sensitive

personal and financial information.

One common tactic used by fraudsters is to contact potential victims over email purporting to be from research organisation's affiliated with the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the World Health Organisation (WHO). They claim to be able to provide the recipient with a list of corona virus infected people in their area. In order to access this information, the victim needs to click on a link, which leads to a malicious website, or is asked to make a payment in Bitcoin. Reporting numbers are expected to rise as the virus continues to spread across the world.

Protect yourself. Watch out for scam messages: Don't click on the links or attachments in suspicious emails, and never respond to unsolicited messages and calls that ask for your personal or financial details.

Shopping online: If you're making a purchase from a company or person you don't know and trust, carry out some research first, and ask a friend or family member for advice before completing the purchase. If you decide to go ahead with the purchase, use a credit card if you have one, as most major credit card providers insure online purchases.

The **Anzac biscuit (Diggers)** is a sweet biscuit popular in Australia. The biscuits have long been associated with the Australian and New Zealand Corps (ANZAC) established in WW1. The term 'digger' is generally accepted as slang for an Australian soldier, and the myth is that it came from Australians digging trenches at Gallipoli.

It is claimed that biscuits were sent by wives and women's groups to soldiers abroad because the ingredients do not spoil easily and the biscuits kept well during naval transportation

So try 'DIGGERS' These are a chewy, coconutty, delicious kind of flapjack..... Thanks to Mary for this recipe, ENJOY!

120g/4½oz plain flour

225g/8oz caster sugar

100g/31/20z oats

85g/3oz desiccated coconut

125g/4½oz butter, plus extra for greasing

1 tbsp golden syrup

1 level tsp bicarbonate of soda

2 tbsp boiling water

- 1. Preheat the oven to 170C/325F/Gas 3. Grease a 20cm/8in square tin
- 2. Mix the flour, sugar, oats and coconut together in a large mixing bowl.
- 3. Put the butter in a small pan with the golden syrup & heat gently until melted. Mix the bicarbonate of soda with the boiling water & add this to the butter and syrup mixture.
- 4. Pour the liquid over the dry ingredients and mix well. Tip the mixture into the tin and press down.
- 5. Bake in the preheated oven for 20 minutes or until golden-brown then let cool for a few minutes before cutting into slices.
- 6. Alternatively, shape the mixture into cookies and place them on a greased baking tray. Cook for 10–15 minutes or until golden-brown.

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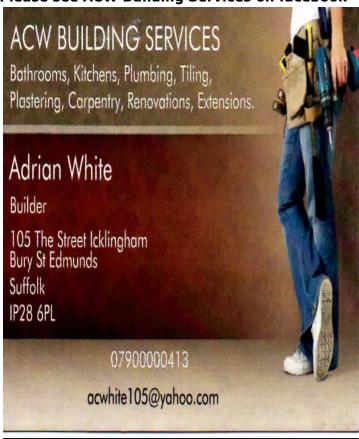

Keep Calm and Carry On

This was a motivational poster introduced bν British Government in preparation for WWII. The poster

was intended to raise the morale of the British public, threatened with widely predicted mass air attacks on major cities. Although 2.45 million copies were printed, and although the Blitz did in fact take place, the poster was only rarely publicly displayed and was little known until a copy was rediscovered in 2000 at a bookshop in Alnwick. It has since been re-issued by a number of private companies, and has been used as the decorative theme for a range of products. Evocative of the Victorian belief in British stoicism - the "stiff upper lip" selfdiscipline, fortitude, and remaining calm in adversity - the poster has become recognised around the world. It was thought that only two original copies survived until a collection of approximately 15 was brought in to the Antiques Roadshow in 2012 and a few further examples have come to light since.
