Suffolk Waste Partnership Recycling Residents across Suffolk are being encouraged to get behind a campaign calling for people to recycle glass properly.

Suffolk Waste Partnership (SWP) is launching 'Glass It's Better in The Bank', a 12-week campaign aimed at getting people to stop putting glass in their household recycling bins and to use a bottle bank instead. This campaign runs until May 31st. District and borough councils, which collect our rubbish, will be applying bin tags and stickers to recycling bins containing glass. Crews will have a prompt in the cab to remind them to be on the look-out and recycling bins may not be emptied if they are found to contain glass.

Glass is not accepted in any household recycling bins as the Materials Recycling Facility is unable to separate glass from other materials.

Glass mistakenly placed in household recycling bins the SWP around £500,000 a year. costs It will NOT be recycled and can spoil other good recycling, especially card and paper.

Glass represents about half of all the wrong material in household recycling bins. Partnership chair Cllr. James Mallinder said: "Glass is 100% recyclable and can be recycled repeatedly without loss of quality, as

long as it's put in the right place, which in Suffolk is glass were mistakenly put into household recycling bins last year, and a further 9,500 tonnes of perfectly recyclable bottles and jars got thrown into Suffolk's rubbish bins – what a waste. "In 20/21 that so much more. Most glass in Suffolk is collected, processed and recycled by the SWP's Glass United Kingdom." - It's Better in The Bank' scheme......

#### **Rhubarb & Custard Blondies**

225g salted butter, plus extra for the tin
200g light brown soft sugar, 100g caster sugar
150g plain flour, 50g custard powder
½ tsp baking powder, 3 medium eggs
250g white chocolate chips, 2 tsp vanilla extract
For the rhubarb & custard swirl : 200g rhubarb (frozen, or canned and drained is fine).

75g caster sugar, pink or red food colouring (optional) 4 tbsp ready-made custard (from a carton is fine) 1. For the rhubarb & custard swirl, put the rhubarb and sugar in a wide pan with 2 tbsp water (omit the water if using canned rhubarb). Cook over a medium heat, stirring frequently for about 10 mins, until the rhubarb breaks down and turns jammy. Add a few drops of food colouring if you want a pinker rhubarb swirl, leave to cool.

2. Heat the oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Put the butter and both sugars into a pan and put over a low heat. Melt together until smooth and shiny, then remove from the heat, and leave to cool for 10 mins while you sieve the flour, custard powder and baking powder in a bowl. Butter a 20 x 30cm baking tin and line with baking parchment.

3. Beat the eggs into the cooled sugar and butter mixture, then fold in the dry ingredients until you have a smooth batter. Stir in 150g of the chocolate chips and the vanilla. Pour into the brownie tin, then use a teaspoon to swirl rhubarb compote on top of the batter. Add dollops of the custard, then swirl a skewer or cocktail stick through the compote to create a marbled pattern.

4. Bake for 35-40 mins until set and the edges are coming away from the sides of the tin, leave in the tin to cool. Melt the remaining 100g chocolate in short blasts in the microwave or in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water. Use a spoon to drizzle the chocolate over the Blondie in a zigzag pattern. Cut into squares to serve.

5. These will keep for three days in an airtight container, or freeze the squares individually.
