If you do not then you may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice. If you do not pay the Notice then you could be taken to court and fined up to £1000. FHDC.

POST BOX THEFT - The theft of two historic Royal Mail post boxes from Suffolk villages over the past three weeks is a "worrying trend", according to a top rural police officer. Sergeant Brian Calver, said

the iconic post boxes - which have been a feature of British streets since the 19th century - are being stolen to be sold online. "In the past three weeks, we've had two go missing, which is a bit of a worrying trend really.

A George V Royal Mail post box was stolen near Ixworth, after being cut from its base and removed on March 28 and a further theft happened near Lowestoft, over the Easter weekend. Similar incidents have taken place in necent months in many counties including

recent months in many counties including Gloucestershire, Staffordshire, Wiltshire and many others.



CRAFT CORNER Up-cycle an old Mirror

You will need:-Mirror with frame Silk flowers - your choice Glue gun, masking tape 'Silver' spray paint - colour your choice



Rhinestones - if liked

Step 1. Cover the mirror glass with masking tape.

Step 2. Remove the flowers from the stems. You may need to trim the remaining plastic on the back of the flower so it can be flush with the mirror.

Step 3. Begin gluing leaves and flowers to the mirror frame. I decided just to fill in the corners, but you could fill the entire frame.

Step 4. Spray paint the flowers and frame. I used a metallic silver paint. If you're often guilty of over spraying like I am, this project is for you. The more paint on the flowers, the better!

Step 5. Allow the paint to dry, them remove the tape. I decided I wanted a bit more sparkle on my mirror, so I hot glued rhinestones to the flower centres.

A fun time crafting and much less expensive than shop bought. Many thanks to my friend in the USA for this great idea!

In 2013, the garden was gifted to Perennial,

for its long-term preservation.

Suffolk Constabulary published images of 48 dogs in an effort to find their owners after the animals were seized as part of a police operation last month.

Only those people who have not got in touch with the constabulary previously should contact the investigation team via the email address opscout@suffolk.pnn.police.uk if they believe one or more of the dogs could be theirs. All enquiries must be made by 24 May 2021.

Officers are asking people to use the email address only and not to contact the constabulary's Contact and Control Room on 999 or 101.

More than 80 dogs of various breeds and ages were found at West Meadows in Ipswich where police, assisted by partner agencies, executed warrants on Saturday 20 March. Six people were arrested in connection with the operation in March Over the past few weeks officers have been working hard to identify the owners of the 83 dogs. However, due to the lack of identifying features and information, the process has proved to be challenging. As yet, none of the animals have been reunited with their owners.

Now the investigation team is asking potential owners, who have not contacted the constabulary previously to come forward. Proof of ownership can include the following:

- Veterinary/vaccination records clearly identifying the dogs.
- Pictures of the dog with any distinctive markings/scars/distinguishing features.
- Any details of microchipping however, please note, all these dogs either do not have microchips or have chips which may not be correctly registered.
- Other pictures of the dog's) which prove ownership during the dog's life.
- Any purchase details, including details of where the dog was purchased from and/or receipts.
- Any records of reporting the dog's) lost/stolen either to police or on other websites/charities.
- Some dogs are grouped into possible litter groups, but this is not necessarily the case.

The public should also be aware that some of these dogs may have been lost, stolen or moved on over a period of time so they may not look exactly as they did when they were last seen.

Coconut Chicken with Cucumber Salad

A really simple light Asian-style chicken dish

- 1 egg white, lightly beaten
- 2 skinless chicken breasts
- 3 tbsp desiccated coconut
- 1 tsp sunflower oil
- ½ cucumber, thinly sliced on the diagonal
- 1 small red onion, thinly sliced
- 2 tsp caster sugar
- 2 tbsp white wine vinegar or rice vinegar

Method:

STEP 1

Heat oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas 6.

Season the egg white.

Dip the chicken in the egg, then in the coconut. Then place on a lightly oiled baking sheet and bake for 20-25 mins, turning once until the chicken is cooked through.

STEP 2

Meanwhile, tip the cucumber slices into a colander, sprinkle with a little salt and leave for 5 mins to drain. Pat the cucumber slices dry with kitchen paper. In a bowl, mix the onion with the sugar and vinegar, then add the cucumber and serve with the chicken.


