The elections on May 4th 2023 will be the first time that electors will need to bring photo ID with them when they vote at a polling station.

The UK Government has introduced a requirement for voters to show photo ID when voting at a polling station at some elections. This new requirement will apply for the first time in England at the local elections on Thursday 4 May 2023.

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

Passport - Driving licence (including provisional licence) - Blue badge

Certain concessionary travel cards - Biometric Immigration document - Defence identity

card - Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)

Certain national identity cards

For more information on which forms of photo ID will be accepted, visit electoralcommission.org.uk/voterID or call their helpline on 0800 328 0280.

If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a Voter Authority Certificate. You can apply for this at voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk.

If you need any help with applying for a Voter Authority Certificate or want to request an application form, contact your local council. 

MOZART REQUIEM PRESS RELEASE

Stowmarket Chorale presents... "Mozart 1791"

on Saturday 18th March 2023 7.30 p.m. at the John Peel Centre for Creative Arts, Church Walk, Stowmarket, IP14 1ET

Stowmarket's resident choir brings a performance of Mozart's final mesmerising masterpiece, his Requiem, to the John Peel Centre, featuring soloists of the Royal Opera House Extra Chorus Covent Garden. The choir will also sing the Ave Verum and the concert programme will include the opera arias:

'Per questa bella mano' - for bass & double bass obbligato 'Torna di Tito a lato' - for mezzo soprano from La Clemenza di Tito The Duet - 'Bei Männern, welche Liebe fühlen' from The Magic Flute

Mozart composed part of his Requiem mass in D minor in Vienna in late 1791 but it was unfinished at his death on 5 December that year at the age of only 35. His student Franz Xavier Süssmayr completed it in 1792. Mozart imagines a very dramatic end of the world in the Dies Irae, the day of wrath - whilst Lacrimosa, the day full of tears, is very beautiful and sad. Mozart only wrote the first eight bars before he died. However, in composing the remaining parts Süssmayr may well have accessed Mozart's incomplete notes and have recalled previous discussions with the composer. Regardless of who wrote which parts of the Requiem it still sounds wonderful to most of us.

The Vicar's view

It is now just over 2 years since Caroline and I were appointed to 'The Brecks' Group of seven parishes of which St James, lcklingham forms a very significant part.

In some ways it doesn't seem possible that 2 years has passed already, yet in other ways we seem to have been in post for far longer. It has been a real privilege to try to get to know as many people as we can over that time in the seven parishes that we serve.

We have come to understand the work carried out by Project St. James fundraising to keep the Church open and in good repair and also the Alice Dix Charity and how help can be made accessible in these difficult times. We do not live in a hugely wealthy part of the world, salaries are generally lower than elsewhere and genuine hardship is an 'often felt' but 'seldom spoken of' issue in our local villages.

We are very fortunate to have access to food banks and some limited financial help to those in genuine need, especially if there is a medical reason that contributes to those difficulties. Please get in touch if you would like some confidential assistance or advice.

We find ourselves now racing through 2023 and the church year is no different the Christmas season ended and we moved into Epiphany, which is associated with the visit of the 'wise men' to the infant Jesus when God revealed himself to the world as a baby. We know from Matthew 2:11 these men offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.

For many church traditions, the season of Epiphany extends until Ash Wednesday, which this year is 22nd February. So begins the season of Lent leading to Easter, where we mark the death and resurrection of Jesus.

Just like everyday life; for us it seems that each year passes faster and faster, change is noticeable all around us as the spring bulbs emerge and the nights become lighter.

I suppose it is true what they say? Time really does fly by. That it is a sign that I am getting older ... even though I remain in complete denial! The mirror however tells a different story!

Wishing you all many blessings at this time as we head rapidly towards Easter.


