#### JOIN COMMUNITY SPEED WATCH



The Community Speed Watch (CSW) initiative allows members of the community to address the issue of speeding by becoming actively involved in road safety, monitoring speeds at safe locations with

speed detection equipment. The aim is to encourage drivers to choose to drive at or below the speed limit.

What are the Benefits?

Fewer fatalities and serious injury collisions. Increase in road safety awareness by and for all road users

Enhancing the role of community members as volunteers.

Raise awareness of anti-social road use.

Volunteers must be over 18 years of age and will be subject to a vetting procedure.

Volunteers will be required to sign a CSW agreement. Training for volunteers will include use of the equipment and health and safety issues. The cost of training volunteers, risk assessing potential sites and ongoing administration is borne by the Constabulary.

Volunteers will be covered by the Constabulary's insurance.

The Constabulary will provide a full set of equipment to conduct CSW activities.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

At the West Stow Anglo Saxon Village you can see the Rendlesham Hoard that's on display until the 23rd July. There are many items including gold, silver and bronze coins that were excavated recently, which are believed to be from an Anglo Saxon Kings court.

The display focuses on the main story of royal Rendlesham at its height when it was the power centre of the early East Anglian kingdom 1,400 years ago.

Normal entrance and parking fees apply. Open 10am - 4pm. There are a good range of activities at West Stow, including a well-illustrated talk on the 2nd March about our little known but greatest knight. An undefeated knight at the dawn of chivalry who beat off the French invasion of 1217. This session lasts about an hour and includes original Medieval object and replica handling. ### PARISH COUNCIL NOTICES Parish Council Precept 2024/25

For Residents information, a review of our budget for 2024-2025 has indicated that with projected expenditure of £11,752.00, and the legal costs associated with the West Suffolk Local Plan and village category position, we need to increase our Precept. We have calculated that our precept request this year must be £11,452.00 (£76.61 for a Band D property). This would equate to an increase of 20.95%, an increase of £13.27 per household over the year. This increase will show on your 2024/25 Council Tax Bill.

#### GARDENING TIPS FOR SPRING & BUILD-A-BUG HOTEL

- Pick off any developing seed heads on daffodils and other spring bulbs, but leave the foliage to die back naturally until Derby Day!
- Cut dogwoods, willows, continues and paulownias right down to the base to promote vigorous new growth
- Tidy up alpines as they start to flower, removing dead foliage, then mulch with grit to keep the foliage off damp soil
- Plant faded forced bulbs out in the garden for blooms next year
- Mulch borders generously with garden compost
- Finish pruning Roses early in March
- Make a Bug Hotel this is the perfect craft project for children, getting them outdoors & discovering nature, it's also a great way to encourage wildlife into your outdoor space.

What you need - Dry sticks or twigs - perfect for ladybirds to hibernate in. • Hollow stems - such as old bamboo canes or rolled newspaper straws. • Blocks of wood - drilled holes in blocks of wood make good nesting sites for solitary bees (get an adult to help when you drill the holes). • Dry leaves - these mimic the forest floor. • Corrugated cardboard - roll

up into a cylinder for lacewings. • Straw and hay – insects can burrow in and find safe hibernation sites. • Loose bark – beetles, centipedes, spiders and woodlice all lurk beneath wood and bark.



1. Create the walls of your bug hotel by using a container, for example: an old plant pot, bricks, the end of a plastic milk carton, ice cream container, a glass jar, a cardboard coffee cup or a tin can. 2. If you want to hang your hotel, use some garden string to loop around the container or create holes for the string to use before filling it. 3. If you are making a big bug hotel on the ground, use wood, pallets or fallen branches & bricks to layer up to make your super-sized container. Make sure it's solid so it won't fall over! 4. Create a cosy interior by filling your home with a selection of the materials you have collected. If necessary, cut the material to fit. Pack the materials tightly so they won't fall out, making sure that the hollow ends face outwards.



#### **RASBERRY & HONEY FLAPJACKS**

150g butter, 150g light brown soft sugar 4 tbsp honey, 300g porridge oats, 100g frozen raspberries 1.Heat oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6 and line a 20 x 20cm baking tin with parchment. Melt the butter, sugar, honey

and a pinch of salt in a pan. Once the mixture is bubbling and combined, stir in the oats.

2. Tip the oat mixture into the lined baking tin and press down with the back of a spoon. Scatter over the raspberries, then lightly press them into the oat mixture. Bake for 25-30 mins until golden brown. Leave to cool, then cut into 9 or 12 flapjacks.

#### YUMMY GOLDEN SYRUP FLAPJACKS

250g jumbo porridge oats, 125g butter plus extra for the tin 125g light brown sugar, 2-3 tbsp golden syrup (depending on how gooey you want it)

- 1. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Put the oats, butter, sugar and golden syrup in a food processor and pulse until mixed be careful not to over mix or the oats may lose their texture.
- 2. Lightly butter a 20 x 20cm baking tin and add the mixture. Press into the corners with the back of a spoon so the mixture is flat and score into 12 squares. Bake for around 15 mins until golden brown

Make these easy flapjacks using just a few ingredients. Serve with a cuppa for a perfect mid-morning pick-me-up, or freeze for a later date.



EQUINOX - There are only two times of the year when the Earth's axis is tilted neither toward nor away from the sun, resulting in a "nearly" equal amount of daylight and darkness at all latitudes. These events are referred to as Equinoxes. The word equinox is derived from two Latin words - aequus (equal) and nox (night). The spring and fall equinoxes are the only two days during the year when the sun rises exactly due east and sets exactly due west.

On the morning of the equinox the Great Sphinx of Giza gazes directly at the sun. There are a number of other ancient sites that align with the equinox as well, like Chichen Itza and Angkor Wat.

In days past, swallows and celandine were the twin harbingers of spring! These little plants respond to the daylight; opening at dawn and closing at dusk, and like all true sun-worshippers, they will hide away before rain! The old Celtic name for them is 'grian', which means 'sun'. They are said to 'gladden the heart' and represent the 'joy to come'!
