Mildenhall Library is now open in the new Mildenhall Hub on Sheldrick Way

The library will be the first service to open in the new building. Once fully open, as well as being the exciting new home of the library, the Mildenhall Hub will bring together a new school, leisure facilities, a health centre, advice functions, a children's centre, and will also house desk space for Suffolk Police, West Suffolk Council, Suffolk County Council and the NHS, including Public Health England.

The library will initially be open Monday to Saturday 10am to 3pm. Once the hub is fully open from 14 June, library opening times will be increasing significantly to over 100 hours a week and it will be open every day. The final stages of the work have been delayed slightly

but West Suffolk Council have now confirmed the public opening dates for the new facilities at the multi-million-pound Mildenhall Hub.

Bruce Leeke, CEO of Suffolk Libraries, said: "We're very excited about moving to the Mildenhall Hub. You can't miss us as the library sits at the heart of the development, offering a flexible and contemporary space. We take pride in our strong roots in the local community and look forward to working with other Hub partners to make the library even more than the sum of its parts. Libraries are a gateway to so much and we want to take this opportunity to encourage even more people to use our services and enjoy our diverse range of activities.

The Summer Reading Challenge is back!
This gets children reading over the long summer which helps to maintain their literacy skills. This year's theme is Wild World Heroes, a group of friends making their town even better for the people and animals that live there. The challenge is open to all children aged 4 - 11. They can sign up for free, read six books over the summer holidays and collect a prize for each one from the library. If they complete the challenge, they'll collect a certificate.

The challenge will start on 17th July.

EASY STRAWBWERRY RIPPLE ICECREAM 600ml double cream, 395g can condensed milk ½ tsp vanilla extract, ½ lemon, zested & juiced 200g soft-set strawberry jam

Method:Beat the double cream with an electric whisk until it holds its shape. Keep beating on a lower speed & gradually pour in the condensed milk & vanilla extract, then slowly add the lemon zest & juice. Put mixture in a baking tin or container that will fit in freezer.

Drop jam over the ice-cream in little blobs using a teaspoon, drag a skewer through blobs to make the ripple effect. Some jam will disappear but that's okay. Cover & put in freezer for at least 3 hrs. This is soft-set ice cream, so you don't need to take it out of the freezer too far ahead of serving. Will keep for up to 3 months in freezer!! A view from St James Church

The 1st November 2020 was a significant date for churches in and around Mildenhall, with the joining of 17 parishes into the brand new "Forest Heath Team Benefice".

Such a large group of churches, working collaboratively together now means that 4 Team Vicars, 1 Team Curate; plus numerous willing retired clergy and lay ministers will be serving those 17 churches.

St James at Icklingham are part of a sub-group of 7 churches within Forest Heath now known as "The Brecks Group". This group has been without a Vicar of its own for just over 4 years.

On 11th February 2021 a Licensing Service took place, installing ministers into the area. The service took place in the virtual arena, on Zoom! (Who knew what that was 12 months ago?)

The result for Icklingham; along with Herringswell, Red Lodge, Tuddenham with Cavenham, Eriswell and Beck Row is that all have newly installed, permanent and full-time ministers.

We are Revd David Butcher as Team Vicar and Revd Caroline Butcher as Assistant Curate, a husband and wife team, living in Mildenhall and covering those 7 churches.

We are looking forward to working locally to support ministry in the villages. Our churches are cautiously reopening for 'in church' worship with Icklingham meeting at 9.30am on the 2nd and 4th Sunday of each month. Since March 2020 we have held a weekly online 'Zoom' worship service every Sunday at 11am, which has proved to be very popular.

You can even sing to your hearts content in the comfort of your own home!

We invite you to visit us, as we would love to meet you in church, but if you're not yet ready to meet in groups like that but you would like to join us on 'Zoom' just email me and I will send the link.

AVM 21/22.2 REPORT OF THE PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN

The Chairman firstly thanked members of the Parish Council for their support in what had been a very unusual year and looking forward to being back to normal with face-to-face meetings. Followed by a brief overview of what had been achieved.

CRAFT CORNER - MAKE EASY TILE COASTERS
You will need small Ceramic Tiles, Patterned Scrapbook
or decoupage Paper, Mod Podge and a Foam brush
Clear acrylic sealer and a piece Felt (or small adhesive
cork pads)

- Trace around the tile onto a piece of the paper.
 Cut out.
- Add a thin layer of Mod Podge to the top of the tile with a foam brush. Position the paper on top of the tile. Gently smooth down.
- Add a layer of Mod Podge on top of the paper. Let dry for 15 minutes and then add another layer.
- Repeat one more time. (3 layers in total)
- Once the Mod Podge is dry seal with a clear acrylic sealant spray.
- Cut a square out of felt and glue it to the bottom of the tile (or use small cork pads) so it won't scratch your table surface.
- For other ideas you could try paint sample/chips or paper lace doilies, newspaper, old maps or paper napkins.




