Police are appealing for information following a burglary at a home in Lackford during Tuesday 21st May. The burglary occurred at a home on Holden Road sometime between 8am & 4pm. Offenders have forced open the rear patio doors to gain entry. An untidy search of the home was undertaken. Jewellery

and collective coins were stolen.

If you noticed any unusual activity nearby or have any information about this burglary please contact Suffolk Police. quoting crime reference37/28767/19. Alternatively, use the non-emergency telephone number 101.

Police are appealing for the public to remain vigilant following reports of a distraction burglary in the village of Fornham All Saints near Bury St. Edmunds. Also on Tuesday 21st May between 11.30am and 12 noon, two males with Irish accents have knocked on the door of an elderly resident, they claimed to be from the council. A purse containing cash and bank cards were stolen. Officers advise members of the public to visit the Suffolk Constabulary website and look at the First Principle crime prevention advice on dealing with cold callers.

Motorists in Suffolk are being urged to keep their vehicles secure following a series of van thefts. The warning has been issued after 28 Mercedes Sprinter vans that use keyless entry were stolen between October 2018 and April 2019 with the majority of offences taking place in Ipswich area where 23 vans have been stolen. Vans have generally been stolen overnight from residential areas and car parks. Keyless theft of a vehicle occurs when criminals use a transmitter to amplify the signal being emitted from the genuine key inside the owners house to reach the vehicle outside. This allows it to be unlocked and driven away in seconds.

As a consequence of these thefts we are conducting a letter drop to all registered keepers of such Sprinter vans in Ipswich area in the coming weeks to raise awareness of the issue amongst owners. The message is relevant to all vehicle owners – make sure you use as many preventative measures as possible to keep your vehicle secure, officers are urging owners of such vehicles to be vigilant and take sensible precautions. ELDERFLOWER CORDIAL

Fresh elderflower heads are essential for this homemade cordial recipe. You'll start to see them on trees from around mid-May, in the UK season. You'll never want to buy it pre-made again!

- 1.2kg granulated sugar
- 4 un-waxed lemons
- 4 un-waxed limes
- 50 or so large elderflower heads, cleaned
- 65g citric acid. (available from chemists)
- **1.** Put the sugar in a large enamel, glass or ceramic bowl and add 1.75 litres boiling water. Stir to dissolve the sugar, then allow to cool to blood temperature (about 37C).
- **1.** Thinly slice the lemons and limes and add to the sugar solution. Discard the stalks of the elderflowers, then add the flowers to the bowl with the citric acid and stir. Cover and leave for 24-36 hours in a cool dark place.
- 2. Strain through a fine sieve, then strain again, this time through a sieve lined with muslin cloth. Decant into sterilised glass bottles and keep in a cool dark place for up to 6 months. Once open, refrigerate and use within a month. Or freeze the finished cordial in small plastic containers and defrost as needed.



GARDENING TIPS FOR JUNE

- 1. Hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds
- 2. Be water-wise, in drought-affected areas
- 3. Pinch out side shoots on tomatoes
- 4. Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes
- 5. Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside
- 6. Mow lawns at least once a week
- 7. Plant out summer bedding
- 8. Stake tall or floppy plants
- 9. Prune many spring-flowering shrubs
- 10. Shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch
