POLICE CONNECT
Keeping you informed, keeping your community safe

The following is a Police Connect message.

With the harvest season underway Suffolk Police are warning of the dangers of climbing on straw stacks awaiting collection from fields.

A police spokesperson warned "The stacks can be in excess of 40 feet high and the bales weigh nearly half a ton each. People are not allowed to run amok on construction sites because it is too dangerous, and the same must apply for farms; they are a workplace with many potential hazards and should not be treated as a playground.

If children are trespassing and damaging the bales and if they are injured in a quiet, isolated area, they may not be found for hours. Parents and guardians need to be made aware that they are responsible for their children's whereabouts."

There are a number of footpaths around farms and police are appealing for any walkers that are in the area and noticed any children or youths playing by hay bales to call 101

BLACKBERRY PIE BARS

3 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/2 cups sugar, divided
1 teaspoon baking powder
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon salt
Zest and juice of one lemon, keep separate
1 cup (2 sticks) cold unsalted butter, cut into 1 inch slices
1 large egg
2 teaspoons vanilla extract
4 cups fresh blackberries
4 teaspoons cornstarch



1. Preheat the oven to 190° C. Grease a 9×13 inch pan.
2. In a food processor, pulse together flour, 1 cup of sugar, baking powder, cinnamon, salt and lemon zest. Add the butter, egg and vanilla extra. Pulsing until dough is crumbly. Pat half of dough into the bottom of the prepared pan, saving the remaining dough for the topping.
3. In a medium bowl, stir together the remaining 1/2 cup sugar, cornstarch and lemon juice. Gently mix in the blackberries. Sprinkle the blackberry mixture evenly over the crust. Crumble remaining dough over the berry layer.
4. Bake in preheated oven for about 45 minutes, or until top is slightly brown (you are only looking for the top to slightly brown, if you cook for too long - the bottom will burn).
5. Cool completely before cutting into squares. Store in an airtight container.

blackberry liqueur

500gms blackberries
(fresh or frozen)

1/2 litre vodka

1/4 litre water

350g sugar

Thaw the blackberries (if frozen) and blend in a liquidiser. Add the vodka and pour into a screw top bottle. Leave for 24 hours, shaking occasionally. Strain the mixture through a sieve or muslin cloth.

Mix the water and sugar and heat gently until you have a syrup. Cool, then add to the blackberry mixture. Pour the liqueur into a Bottle. Enjoy !

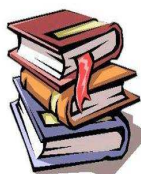

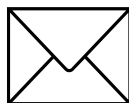
