I am the County Councillor for Row Heath Division on Suffolk County Council and have been honoured to represent the village for several years. I know lcklingham well and have lived in the area all my life.

Over that period, I have worked on many projects in the village alongside your hard-working Parish Council. Of course, one of the main issues in the village is traffic and speeding. There is not much we can do about the level of traffic, given that it's the main road from Mildenhall to Bury St. Edmunds. But I lobby that the highways team priories any work needed in the village given the traffic, and I work with the Parish Council on signage to remind people to slow down when driving through the village. Everyone knows the speed limit is 30mph, but clearly, we have to remind people to slow down.

At the county council, I consistently make the case to keep Council Tax as low as possible, respecting Council Tax is your hard-earned money but at the same time balancing the need to seek improvements to everything from Child Protection Services, how we support older people in our community to repairing our roads.

We recently announced a further £10M investment in road repairs, and through the highways reporting tool, we aim to get these done quicker. If you come across something that needs fixing, the highway reporting tool is the first place to report it, so it goes on the system and is highlighted to the community highway engineer. www.highwaysreporting.suffolk.gov.uk

As winter approaches, the pressure on household bills increases, and if you are struggling, there is help with the Cost of Living, and it is well worth seeing what support is available.

In November 'Keep Britain Tidy' launched a new campaign 'Cigarette butts rubbish'. Advertising highlights smokers the paradox in their behaviour; while they wouldn't litter a crisp packet, they would litter a cigarette butt.

Cigarette butts are made of plastic and do not biodegrade. Yet, despite only 12% of the population being regular smokers we know that somehow cigarette butts make up an astonishing 66% of all littered items.

If you smoke make sure you put your cigarette butts in a bin or a container, because cigarette butts are rubbish!

The duck in the advertising embodies the smoker's social conscience. This is a humour-driven campaign, with a sharp insight at its heart that has proven highly effective.

'Cigarettes are rubbish' is at the core of programme to tackle cigarette littering, seeking to establish a shift in culture to change smokers' littering attitudes and behaviours permanently. This high-profile national campaign is underpinned by research and supported behaviour change practical through interventions with a range of businesses and land managers.

However, millions every day cigarette butts are littered, and every day we don't act millions more will join them - despite the best efforts of local authorities to clear them up.

This problem cannot wait - we need to do this now. Butts should go in bins!

PARISH COUNCIL NOTICES

The Suffolk Highways Online Reporting Tool https://highwaysreporting.suffolk.gov.uk/

allows you to report a new defect and monitor the status of existing reports, such as; blocked drains, Cycle-lane/tracks & public right of way issues, damaged drain/manhole cover, vegetation and mud on the road, flooding on a road or pavement, missing/damaged barriers or guardrails, missing/damaged or obscured signs, missing/faded road markings, Potholes & Pavement defects, trees/hedges affecting the highways or footways.

Do not report a highways problem online if it poses an immediate danger to public safety call 0345 606 6171 Or if it's on a trunk road in Suffolk call the National Highways Information Line on 0300 123 5000

Dog Fouling in the Play Area

Recently dog fouling on the playing field and near the play area, has started to become an issue. I am sure that all residents that own dogs will assist us by ensuring they collect their dog's waste and dispose of it in the Dog Waste Bin provided at the playing field (not the Green bin, as this is not suitable for dog waste). Dog Waste can be very hazardous to children, causing blindness (Toxocariasis).

Under the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014 in England and Wales, a person who doesn't clean up after their dog may face an on-the-spot fine of up to £80. These fines are known as fixed penalty notices. If a person refuses to pay, they can be taken to the local Magistrates Court for the dog fouling offence and fined up to £1,000. The Parish Council hope that this notice will encourage all dog owners to act responsibly, and to improve the problem without the need to introduce fines for offenders.

Reporting Anti-Social Behaviour:-

Anti-social behaviour can be rowdy, noisy behaviour in otherwise quiet neighbourhoods night-time noise from houses or gardens, especially between 11pm and 7am threatening, drunken or 'yobbish' behaviour - vandalism, graffiti and fly-posting -dealing or buying drugs on the street - litter and fly-tipping rubbish - aggressive begging - drinking in the street - setting off fireworks late at night - vehicle-related nuisance

Report anti-social behaviour to your local district or borough council. 
